

Fund Manager's Report

In March, the fund declined 10.4% in MYR terms, underperforming the benchmark by 274 bps on the back of macro headwinds revolving around the Covid19 outbreak and impact on the energy sector. For equity, the performance was mainly driven by the financials and consumer discretionary sectors.

The FTSE Bursa Malaysia Kuala Lumpur Composite Index ("KLCI") declined 8.9% in Mar (YTD: -15.0%) as concerns over the Covid-19 outbreak intensified which was further exacerbated by the sharp 47% fall in Brent crude oil price following the breakdown in OPEC production cut agreement between Saudi Arabia and Russia. The Malaysian government has enforced an initial 2-week movement control order (MCO) since 18 Mar which was extended until 14 April as the number of new Covid-19 infections spiked. To mitigate the economic impact of Covid-19 and MCO, a RM250bn stimulus package was announced with the primary focus of (i) sustaining private consumption and confidence, (ii) preserving the viability and continuity of domestic business entities; and (iii) strengthening the domestic economy. While the stimulus package amounts to 17% of GDP, direct government spending is only RM25bn which is equivalent to 1.7% of GDP. Bank Negara Malaysia also cuts its Overnight Policy Rate by a further 25bps to 2.5% and slashed its Statutory Reserve Requirement by 100 bps to 2.0% in order to inject liquidity into the economy.

In view of the rising market risk premium and volatility, we remain defensive for capital perseverance. The focus will be on high yielding and growth stocks but will be more selective on quality names with resilient earnings and track record.

'Based on the fund's portfolio returns as at 15 March 2020, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this fund is 6.180 and is classified as "Moderate" (source: Lipper). "Moderate" includes funds with VF that are above 6.110 but not more than 8.810. The VF means there is a possibility for the fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six months. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
