



Fund Manager's Report

APDMA (MYR class) increased its NAV/unit by 1.88% in May. Asian equities rose 2.36% (in MYR), led by India and the Philippines while Malaysia and Taiwan lagged, as the number of new Covid-19 cases peaked in India but surged in Malaysia and Taiwan. Rising Covid-19 infections in Asia has been a headwind for the Asian markets as we saw the resurgence of new cases such as in Malaysia, Singapore and Taiwan. Encouragingly, India saw the peak in number of new cases, which has been declining since. We believe that countries are now better prepared to deal with the resurgence of Covid-19 cases and some countries are stepping up on vaccination program, hence the impact of current restrictions will not be as significant as a year before. Of note, though, is that global inflation has risen due to higher input prices from raw materials and energy, as well as cost pressures arising from the shortage of component parts. While we maintain our view that the rise in inflation is transitory since the unemployment rate is still high, we need to keep an eye on signs of sustained inflationary pressures. Volatility in equities market will ensue when inflation concerns and tapering expectations build.

We maintain a growth orientation in our portfolio construction in anticipation of a broadening in economic recovery. Asset allocation is about 68% equities and the balance in fixed income instruments and money markets. Portfolio investments: (1) are slightly biased towards North Asia and Singapore (2) niche companies which are long-term winners with favorable supply discipline or little competition; (3) structural growth geared towards the new economy. While we expect materials and industrials to benefit from economic recovery, we have used the recent correction in the technology sector to add technology leaders to our portfolio. For fixed income, we are invested in mid-to-short dated credit securities which would benefit from the economic recovery.

'Based on the fund's portfolio returns as at 15 May 2021, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this fund is 11.340 and is classified as "Moderate" (source: FIMM). The VF means there is a possibility for the fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF.
